



## Code Red and Code Purple

No need to worry! Let's just practice so we know what to do in an emergency.

# Code Red

1. You will hear a short-repeated whistle.
2. The adult you are with will also need to blow the whistle to let other adults and children know about it.
3. An adult will say, 'Code Red go to your class'

Or Code Red go to the hall.

4. This is because someone needs medical help and this is private.
5. Some staff will stay with the person who is hurt.
6. We will hear emergency services sirens or voices.
7. You will see emergency workers who are helping the person.



# Code Red in class

- We will carry on as normal.
- We will close the blinds for privacy.
- We will listen to the adults we are with for any new instructions.



# Code Red in hall

- We will wait together until the person has been helped by the medical team.
- We will then go back to class and carry on with our day.



# Code Red

The whistle might make us jump at first but it is only to alert members of staff.

In a Code Red in the classroom, we will carry on as normal.

You can ask questions and share worries.

Your class adults will be with you.

Remember we practise to get ready for this, 'just in case.'

# Code Purple



- You will hear a long whistle with no words, this is the signal for a 'Code Purple'
- The adult you are with will also need to blow the whistle so that all adults hear this signal.
- If you are in the classroom, the door lock will be pushed right to lock the door.
- The blinds will be closed.
- We will move quietly to a safe space in the classroom away from the windows
- We will wait together silently.
- Your class adults will be with you.
- Mrs Curtis or Mrs Rumsby will tell us when we can open the doors with the words "All clear".

# Code Purple

- If you are not in the classroom, go to the nearest classroom quickly and quietly.
- Listen to the instructions given to you by the adult that you are with.
- If you are outside, you will be told where to go. This may be outside or the nearest room.
- Stay with your adult.
- Listen carefully to further instructions.
- For a little while the school will be silent.



# Code Purple Practise

- Remember that this is to prepare us for something that is very unlikely.
- School adults will give you instructions.
- The sound of the whistle is used to alert school adults.
- Once everyone has heard the whistle and we are in Code purple the whistles will stop. It is only a start signal.
- For a little while the school will be silent.



- Practicing the drill can be strange at first
- We will practice the drills so that everyone is confident about what to do.
- Ask questions before or after the drill if you are still unsure.
- It is ok to have a question.
